Parent Responsibilities

- Empower your child, through extensive support and preparatory guidance, to take the lead in managing their study abroad experience.
- Keep open communication with your child about the details of their study abroad program, including academic information, travel arrangements, and finances. Responsible communication is the cornerstone of a successful study abroad experience.
- Understand the set of responsibilities that Marshall Undergraduate International Programs expects all students to adhere to in order to ensure a successful semester abroad.
- Expect that the majority of Marshall Undergraduate International Programs' communications will be directly with your child, but feel free to ask us for clarification or program updates.
- Understand FERPA regulations as they apply to dissemination of student information; please know that for your child's safety, we are obliged to follow federal law.
- Be aware of and research your child's finance arrangements.
- Be aware that other countries are not bound by U.S. legislation to accommodate students with disabilities, and physical facilities and academic resources vary significantly from one overseas site to another.
