

Explanation of USC Marshall School of Business Fees

The following are fees you will be required to pay for your semester at Marshall School of Business. The deadline to pay these fees is by 5.00 PM (PST) of Friday, August 22, 2025.

Student Programming Fee	\$40.00
Transportation Service Fee	\$146.00
Student Health Center Fee	\$700.00
Health Insurance	\$1,224.00

- 1) It is your responsibility to pay any material fee or other fee associated with any courses that you are registered for by Friday, August 22, 2025, as well.
- 2) Fees are subject to change without prior notice.
- 3) At the end of the semester, all IEP students must request for a transcript to be sent to them or their home institution. The current rate is \$12 per PDF transcript, \$15 per paper transcript.

Norman Topping Student Center Fee:

\$11 per Semester

This mandatory fee is assessed to all graduate and undergraduate students at USC. It covers access to the Topping Student Center (on campus), meeting rooms, as well as hard copies of the university Schedule of Classes, etc.

Graduate Program/Graduate Student Services Fee:

\$40.00 per Semester

This mandatory fee is assessed to all USC graduate students. It funds various campus-wide graduate student programs and activities, which support the mission of the university.

<u>Transportation Service Fee:</u>

\$146.00 per Semester

This mandatory fee is charged to offset the prices of the USC Lyft program and the USC Bus system, which will now operate during specified semester breaks as well. Additionally, it will support USC's LA Metro U-Pass Program.

Student Health Center Fee:

\$700.00 per Semester

This mandatory fee is assessed to all USC students who study on the University Park Campus in Los Angeles. Students may use the Health Center's services regardless of their medical insurance plan. **Proof of outside insurance does not allow you to waive this fee.**

Student Health Insurance:

\$1,224.00 per Semester

Student Health Insurance is charged to all students at USC; but you can waive out if your insurance meets certain criteria. See information about insurance waiver at: https://studenthealth.usc.edu/waiver-requirements/.
